

House vs. NCAA, Power 5 Conferences

Damages = \$2.78 Billion over 10-year period



100% paid by NCAA, DI Conferences and DI Institutions

- 42% from insurance and reserves
- 58% from Division I distributions, \$165 Million allocated as follows:
 - 40% FBS Power 4
 - 17% FBS Group of 5
 - 43% Non-FBS







Division I Next Generation Educational and Student-Athlete Centric Model

"Benefits" of an educationcentered athletics model PRIMACY OF EDUCATION Intercollegiate Athletics is centered in education.

> Tools have been developed to help identify a balance point for each fundamental element that permits application by institution, conference, sport, division, and/or subdivision.

"Control" of athlete time and activities Athletics experience "connection to educational outcomes"

Intercollegiate Athletics serves a public purpose and is centered in education.

Financial


Non-profit, institutionally funded, shared athletics revenue

Governance Framework Principles DRAFT 5/15/24 DI STUDENT-ATHLETE GOVERNANCE

- 3. The education, health, safety, well-being, and success of <u>all</u> studentathletes are central to the structure, organization, and decision-making authority of the governance of intercollegiate athletics.
 - a. Meaningful voting authority at every level of Division I governance
 - **New Student-Athlete Policy and Experience Committee**
 - c. New dispute resolution system
 - d. Education and training on governance, leadership, negotiation, legal rights, and more.
